STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME (SRS) 2017 YEARS 7, 8 & 9

Student Resource Scheme - Information, Terms and Conditions

Corinda State High School operates a Student Resource Scheme (SRS) for years 7 to 12 to:

- ensure students have an adequate bank of resources to guarantee a good quality education
- minimise the costs to parents / guardians of providing textbooks and other learning resources to their child or children by securing discounts through bulk ordering
- convenience of sourcing the correct resources

The Student Resource Scheme is offered to parents / guardians as a service and has been supported by the P & C Association and School Council. Many schools do not offer this service and parents / guardians are forced to carry the full cost of purchasing and sourcing all learning materials.

The Student Resource Scheme is a cooperative fund generated by the funds received from Parents/Guardians and the Textbook Government Allowance received by the school. Parents / Guardians are under no obligation to join. Participation is entirely voluntary for an annual fee per student.

The Student Resource Scheme operates under the policies and guidelines of the Department of Education and Training. A Parent / Guardian who does not wish to join the scheme is responsible for providing their child with the items that would otherwise have been provided by the scheme to enable the student to engage with the curriculum.

Parents / Guardians wishing to take advantage of the services provided by the Student Resource Scheme, pay an annual participation fee and sign the relevant form agreeing to the conditions therein. The Student Resource Scheme provides the entire package for the specified participation fee and is not available in part.

Benefits of Joining the Scheme:

- Temporary use of textbooks prescribed for each subject where applicable
- Temporary use of class sets of books, dictionaries, atlases
- Temporary use of reference materials, eBooks, periodicals, novels, DVDs, CDs and texts
- Access to Library resources
- Reproduced class workbooks and worksheets and teacher prepared material which complements and / or substitutes for textbooks
- Minor classroom equipment, digital cameras, video cameras, microphones, graphics tables, iPads, data projectors, webcams, data logger, external DVD devices and scanners.
- Minor classroom consumables
- Additional software including AutoCAD, Photoshop and other subject specific software.
- Access to basic in class consumables
- Student personalised printing allowance \$10 per year
- Student I.D Card (with photo)
- Student Planner
- Annual school magazine

How do I participate in the scheme?

Complete and return the Student Resource Scheme 2017 Participation Agreement form to School Student Services Office with your required payment (as selected in the payment arrangement section of the form) and should be finalised before the first day of school in 2017. Anyone who joins the scheme but fails to pay the full fee may be excluded from the SRS.

Non-Participation

Parents/Guardians who do not wish to participate in the scheme should complete and tick the Non-participation on the Agreement form and return it to the School Student Services Office. These parents / guardians will receive a payment or credit from the school to the value of the Government Allowance (TRA) for their child and will be required to provide all necessary textbooks and resources for their child. A list of the textbooks can be obtained via the Textbook Hire Room and students will be invoiced for resources supplied by the school that are included in this scheme. Non-participants should also refer to the school refund policy.

Student Resource Scheme (SRS) – Parent Contribution:

Parent Contribution to join the 2017 Student Resource Scheme for Year 7 – 12 is an annual fee of \$280 per student.

Parents / Guardians are under no obligation to join, participation is entirely voluntary. This contribution is in addition to the Government Textbook Allowance.

Parents / Guardians wanting to participate in the Student Resource Scheme 2017 should complete the enclosed Student Resource Scheme 2017 Participation Agreement form and return it to the Student Services Office with your required payment before the start of school 2017.

Parents / Guardians not wanting to participate in the Student Resource Scheme 2017 should complete the enclosed Student Resources Scheme 2017 Agreement form as a non-participation and return it to the School Administration Office by the end of November 2016. The school will then contact you with a list of textbooks, equipment and resources you will need to purchase before the start of school 2017.

Payment options are detailed on the 2017 Participation Agreement form.

Financial Difficulties – For those who may be experiencing financial difficulties please take advantage of paying the Student Resource Scheme fee by instalments (as outlined in the Participation Agreement form) or contact School Administration Office on 3379 0222 to discuss alternative arrangements or to request a payment plan application.

Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) – Government Contribution:

The Queensland Government provides a text and resource allowance for eligible students and for Years 7 to 10 \$121 per student and Years 11 -12 \$262 per student. With the approval of the Parents and Citizens' Association schools may be directly provided with this allowance, as such, the Corinda State High School Parents and Citizens' Association has approved the direct payment of the TRA to the school.

This allowance assists with the early purchase of resources so that the advantage of discounts can be secured through bulk ordering. Should parents decide not to participate in the scheme the school will pay the Textbook and Resource Allowance to them. Education Queensland encourages schools to provide a Student Resource Scheme.

All students are eligible for the Textbook and Resource Allowance excluding:

- 1 Students enrolled as a full fee paying overseas students (FFOS)
- 2 Students enrolled in a Centre for Continuing Secondary Education (CCSE)
- 3 Students undertaking part time distance education from a non-state school accredited for distance education
- 4 Students enrolled after the first Friday in August.

Any Student transferring after the end of February from any Qld Secondary School (state or non-state) will be expected to carry a pro rata refund allowance from their departing school to their new school. Corinda SHS will calculate the pro rata amount and advise the parents / guardians of the TBA amount payment to Corinda SHS.

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Purpose of the Scheme

- 1 In accordance with the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the cost of providing instruction, administration and facilities for the education of students enrolled at State schools who are Australian citizens or permanent residents, or children of Australian citizens or permanent residents, is met by the State.
- 2 Parents/carers are directly responsible for providing textbooks and other personal resources for their children while attending school. In recognition that these costs can be high, the school operates a Student Resource Scheme (the "scheme") that enables a parent/carer to enter into an agreement with the school that, for a specified annual participation fee, provides for the temporary use by the student of prescribed textbooks and/or other resources, and/or the purchase of consumables and materials for the student.
- 3 A Student Resource Scheme is separate to and distinct from a request for a voluntary financial contribution.

Benefits of the Scheme

- 4 The purpose of the scheme is to provide the parent/carer with a cost effective alternative to purchasing the prescribed textbooks and/or resources elsewhere, through reduced prices gained from the school's bulk purchasing practices.
- 5 The scheme also ensures that students have consistent personal resources for their education, and saves the parent/carer time and money in sourcing the prescribed materials elsewhere.
- 6 The scheme is not used to raise funds for other purposes, and revenue collected through the scheme is applied only to the operation of the scheme.

Participation in the Scheme

- 7 Participation in the scheme is voluntary, and there is no obligation on a parent to participate in the scheme. A parent's decision to participate or not is based on consideration of the value afforded to them by the scheme.
- 8 The completed and signed Participation Agreement Form should be returned to the school by the advertised date to indicate participation or non-participation in the scheme.
- 9 If a parent/carer chooses to participate in the scheme and completes the Participation Agreement Form, a participation fee will be due and payable by the parent/carer for the items provided by the scheme to the student.
- 10 Payment of the participation fee is a requirement for continued participation in the scheme. An unpaid fee will be subject to the school's debt collection processes.
- 11 A parent/carer who does not wish to participate in the textbook and resource scheme shall inform the school by completing the Participation Agreement Form and returning it to the Administration Office. Arrangements will be made for the parent/carer of students in Years 8 to 12 or of secondary education age to be paid the value of the Textbook and Resource Allowance for each of their eligible children.
- 12 A parent/carer who chooses not to participate in the scheme is responsible for providing the student with all items that would otherwise be provided to the student by the scheme as detailed on the *Non-Participation Form* and *Subject Requirements list* to enable the student to engage with the curriculum.

Parents and Citizens' Association Support of the Scheme

- 13 The operation of the Student Resource Scheme is discussed annually at a meeting of the Parents and Citizens' Association. Parents/carers are extended an invitation to attend this meeting and provided with an opportunity to express their opinions. A vote is taken at this meeting on supporting the operation of the scheme.

Textbook and Resource Allowance

- 14 The Queensland Government provides financial assistance to parents/carers of students in Year 8 to 12 or of secondary education age, attending State and approved non-State schools, to offset the costs of textbooks and other resources. Assistance is provided in the form of a Textbook and Resource Allowance which is paid once a calendar year through the school. Parents/carers have the option to receive the allowance directly from the school or an offset of fees associated with participation in the school's Student Resource Scheme. Payment Arrangements

- 15 Payment of the participation fee may be made by BPAY, Centrelink deduction (arranged through the school), EFT (electronic funds transfer), EFTPOS (Debit Card; MasterCard, Visa) cheque or cash.
- 16 For payment made by direct deposit (EFT) to the bank account indicated on the front of the form, please ensure that the payment reference includes the reference as indicated on the front of this form. The acknowledgement from your financial institution of the successful electronic transfer of funds should be printed and retained as your record of payment.
- 17 Payment of the participation fee may be made in whole or by instalment as indicated on the Participation Agreement Form or for another amount as approved by the Principal.
- 18 For payments made in person by cash, cheque or credit/debit card, a receipt will be provided to the payer. Where payments are received by other methods, a receipt will be provided on request. All receipts and documentation on the scheme should be retained by the parent/carer for future reference and possible taxation purposes.

Parent/Carer Experiencing Financial Difficulties

- 19 A parent/carer wishing to participate in the Student Resource Scheme and experiencing financial hardship is encouraged to contact the school administration to discuss how their financial obligations can be met throughout the school year, or to negotiate alternative arrangements that may be available to accommodate their individual circumstances. Centrelink deduction is a payment option offered by the school. All discussion will be held in the strictest confidence.
- 20 The onus of proof of being so affected is on the parent/carer, and might include a current Health Care Card or other evidence to establish financial hardship.
- 21 Any concessions given to the participation fee will be at the discretion of the Principal.

Terms and Conditions of Participation in the Scheme

- 22 For the purposes of the scheme, where a student is living independent of his/her parents, reference in the terms and conditions to "parent/Carer" is a reference to the independent student.
- 23 Where a parent/carer chooses to join the scheme and completes a Participation Agreement Form, an annual participation fee will be due and payable by the parent/carer to the Student Resource Scheme.
- 24 In return for payment of the participation fee, the scheme will provide the participating student with textbooks and/or resources, consumables and materials as listed on the *Benefits enjoyed by joining the Scheme*, when due for student's use.
- 25 Payment of the participation fee is to be made according to the payment arrangement option indicated by the parent/carer on Participation Agreement Form, or as otherwise approved by the Principal.
- 26 Non-payment of the participation fee by the designated payment date(s) will generate a reminder notice to the parent/carer from the school once per term. The Principal may thereafter undertake debt recovery action for the overdue participation fee including, where warranted, referral to an external debt collection agency. This may result in extra costs being incurred by the parent/carer.
- 27 Without limiting any other action the Principal may take in accordance with these terms and conditions, subject to 26 above, the Principal may withdraw a student's participation in the scheme due to non-payment of a participation fee, and/or may require the return of items provided by the scheme for the temporary use of the student, and/or may withhold the giving of any further items under the scheme until the debt is paid.
- 28 The Principal may refuse to admit a student to the scheme where participation fees are overdue from the previous year's scheme.
- 29 Where participation fees are overdue, the Principal has the discretion to exclude a student from an optional extra curricula school activity.
- 30 The scheme provides the entire package for the specified participation fee, and is not available in parts unless specifically provided for by the school in the fee structure.
- 31 All textbooks and resources provided for temporary use by the scheme remain the property of the scheme and shall be returned at the end of the course or school year or when the student leaves the school, whichever is the earlier. Where an item is not returned, the parent/carer will be responsible for payment to the scheme of the replacement cost of the item. Failure to make payment may result in debt recovery action being undertaken including, where warranted, referral to an external debt collection agency. This may result in extra costs being incurred by the parent/carer.
- 32 Textbooks and other resources provided for temporary student use by the scheme shall be kept in good condition by the student. The school Administration Office shall be notified immediately of the loss or negligent damage to any issued item. Where an issued item is lost or negligently damaged, parents/carers will be responsible for payment to the scheme of the replacement cost of the item. Failure to make payment may result in debt recovery action being undertaken including, where warranted, referral to an external debt collection agency. This may result in extra costs being incurred by the parent/carer.
- 33 The parent/carer is responsible for supplying the student with any additional student materials that are not provided by the Student Resource Scheme, as indicated on the *Subject Requirements List* or otherwise advised by the school.
- 34 If a student enters the scheme after the first week of school, a pro-rata participation fee will apply, calculated on a 40 week school year basis.
- 35 If a student, having paid a participation fee, leaves the school through the year, a pro-rata refund will be made to the parent/carer, calculated on the participation fee paid, less the cost of consumed materials, replacement cost of items lost or negligently damaged, course fees for certificates undertaken, administration and diary costs, plus the pro-rata Textbook and Resource Allowance calculated on a 40 week school year basis.
- 36 As the scheme operates for the benefit of participating parents/carers and is funded solely from participation fees. Resources provided by the scheme will not be issued to students whose parents/carers choose not to participate in the scheme.
