EXTRACURRICULAR AT CORINDA

The extracurricular activities and opportunities offered at Corinda State High School embrace all interests and passions of our community. Participation in extracurricular activities aligns with our Positive Education framework, allowing students to develop in all aspects of our PERMAH model – Positive Emotions, Health, Engagement, Relationships, Meaning and Accomplishment. Students will engage with like-minded peers, be challenged in new ways to excel and compete to further their sense of belonging in the Corinda Community.

Each curriculum area provides teams, challenges and competitions to further a student's key interests and learning areas. From sporting Gala Days to Debating and Mooting, there is an option for every student. In addition, Corinda also supports giving back the community. There are a variety of volunteering experiences coordinated across the school to facilitate these ventures. The majority of extracurricular activities are schedule outside of school hours. Some are linked to key curriculum areas and learnings, whilst others can address a desire your child may have outside their timetable.





DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES

\$20 Boss Program	Students will participate in a number of afterschool workshops to design and plan a real-world business venture. They will be issued with \$20 to help fund the start-up of their venture. They will run their venture during a school lunch time, with the goal of being able to pay back their start-up loan.
Robotics Club	Starting in Term 2 students will meet regularly to engage with robotics activities and digital technologies activities. Students with all levels of coding abilities are welcome to join.
Coding Club (CiY)	Students who want to dabble in a range of technologies, including 3D printing, game creation and robotics can sign up for the after school coding club that is usually run in Term 3 by CiY Coding Club. This program is run based on the availability of CiY Coding Club, and based on the number of students who sign up. There is a fee involved which will be communicated at the time of booking.
Big Idea Business Grant	Students who have a business idea are encouraged to submit an application to the Big Ideas Business Grant. Corinda recognises the importance of fostering enterprise thinking and believe that our students have a lot to offer as young entrepreneurs. Students can apply for business grants up to \$2000 to help fund the start-up of their business ideas. During Term 2 and 3, students can work with the Head of Department of Digital Technologies to research and develop their business concepts and enhance their applications. Announcement of the grant winners are in Term 4.

Digital Technologies Golden Opportunities Day	Offered to students in years 5 and 6, students can come along to a day at Corinda State High School and learn all about micro:bits and digital technologies. Students are provided with their own micro:bit that they can take home and continue exploring the world of code
Young Entrepreneurs Golden Opportunities Day	Offered to students in years 5 and 6, students can come along to a day at Corinda State High School and explore the world of entrepreneurs. They will engage in the design thinking process to develop a business concept that solves a real-world problem.



THE ARTS

Senior Dance Troupe	Students in years 10 - 12 participate in a competitive dance team to represent the school at State Dance Competitions. Styles include Jazz, Musical Theatre, Contemporary and Lyrical.	
Dance Crew	Students participate in a competitive Hip Hop Dance Crew to represent the school. Open to all year levels.	
Tap Troupe	Students participate in a competitive dance team in the style of tap to represent the school. Open to all year levels.	
Drama club/Scene Project	Students work in a team environment to stage a drama performance from an original script performed at QLD Theatre Company.	
Tutor sessions (private - cost involved) for vocal, piano and guitar	Students participate in private tuition in in instruments in solo setting or small group.	
Still life drawing	Students engage in a formal artistry session of still life drawing. Maturity and art interest needs to be demonstrated prior to sign up.	
Creative Generation	Students participate in an en masse performance in music dance and orchestra.	

AGRICULTURE

Students have the opportunity to look after many animals including; cattle, sheep, alpacas and poultry. Students assist with looking after a particular type of animal – feeding, checking their animal and general maintenance jobs.
The Sheep Team attend a number of shows during the year to present their animals, including the Ekka.
Students maintain bee colonies and work to produce high quality products including Corinda Honey and beeswax products.
This team will focus on maintaining the garden, aquaponics and hydroponic systems which are used to grow vegetables at The Ag Centre. These are key jobs in the day to day operation of the farm.

INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGIES AND DESIGN DEPARTMENT

Human Powered Vehicles	Students represent Corinda SHS at various HPV events throughout the year. They work on fitness, nutrition and working as a team.
Australian Space Design School Competition (ASDC)	ASDC is designed for secondary school students with a passion for space, or are considering a future in STEM fields. Students respond to an engineering Request For Tender (RFT) and design a futuristic space settlement, planning structural engineering, operations and infrastructure, personnel factors, and automation.
ASDC National Competition	The ASDC Finals is a high-tempo industry simulation event. Finalists from the ASDC Qualifying Round are formed into aeronautical engineering companies, and are given a new RFT, with a brand new space settlement scenario. They then have 30hrs to meet these requirements, and submit a presentation. The Finals culminate in formal presentations from each of the companies, to a panel of judges.
International Senior Secondary Space Design Competition	Winning teams of the ASDC National have the opportunity to compete against the world within the same constraints as above competition. Students need to firstly break down language barriers within their teams, work with NASA Engineers over the space of 72 hours.
Solomon Island BRIDGE School Partnership	BRIDGE allows students to collaborate on projects, practice language skills with students at their partner school.

SPORTS

West Brisbane Gala Days	Students represent Corinda SHS in various sports throughout the year in a round robin competition. Winning teams may progress through to the Met Finals competition.	
Representative Sport	Students trial for Eastern Taipans district team and progress through to Met West representation if selected. This can lead to representing Queensland Secondary School Sport.	
Gym Sessions	The school gym is open free of charge 2 morning sessions a week for students.	
School Carnivals	Students compete in school carnivals for Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics. Top performing students' progress to District Trials for each carnival in their selected events, then Met West trials and eventually Qld State Championships if successful.	
Futsal	Students can represent the school in Futsal at various competitions throughout the year.	
Netball	Students represent Corinda State High School in various carnivals such as the Vicki Wilson Cup and Shield (Juniors/Seniors).	

Basketball	Students welcome to train weekly as a development squad. Students are selected from this squad to represent Corinda SHS in various competitions.
Badminton Club	Students have the opportunity to play badmintion for Corinda.
